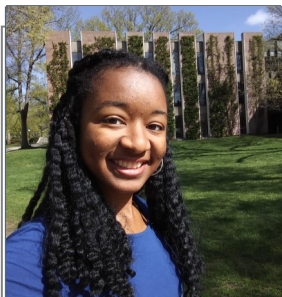

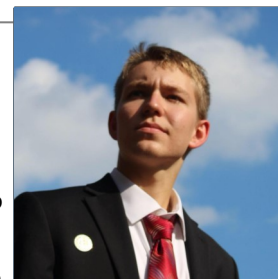

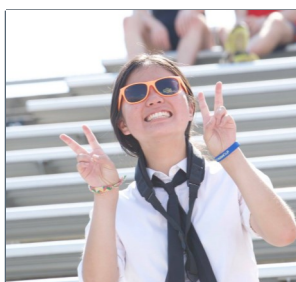
### Kyle

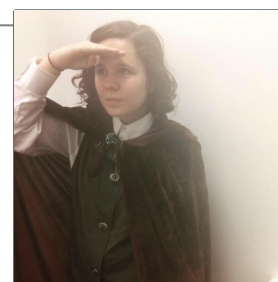
### Daniel

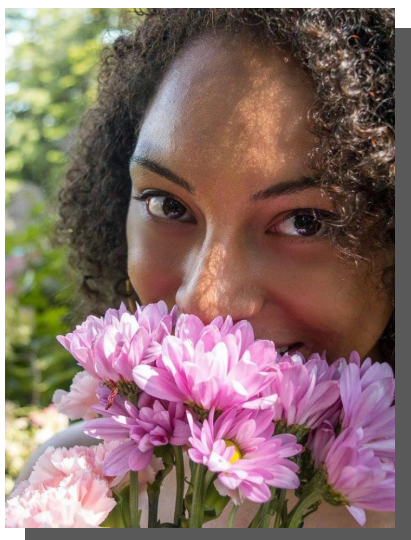
After graduation, Caris will be taking part in Teach for America and will be a blessing to everyone she meets and mentors there!

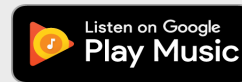


### “Home Awaits”: still online!
