MD's Corner: KS' 2023 Repetoire

Before coming to Princeton, I had never once imagined that I would be part of an a cappella group, let alone direct one. To be completely transparent, I hadn't even considered being Music Director until well into last semester. But if there is one thing I've learned in these past few years, it's that God has a habit of using us in ways we could never plan for.

Looking back on this past semester, I can honestly say that this role has been one of the most fulfilling positions I've ever had the opportunity of being in. Leading a musical group is challenging and time-consuming, but it is all the more rewarding. It has taught—and continues to teach—me so much, not only musically, but in patience, gentleness, leadership, and humility.

One of the biggest challenges I've faced was trying to find the balance between KS as a music group and KS as a fellowship. It's so easy to get caught up in trying to sound perfect, and getting frustrated when we sound anything less than that. Especially in a year where KS is much smaller than normal, it was easy to get discouraged when we were missing voice parts and balance was a struggle. But another thing I've learned is that God is not glorified through our perfection, but in our true and authentic worship. And while we should always strive to do our very best, I've found that taking breaks from drilling during rehearsals to analyze lyrics and have worship jams is much needed. This semester, we learned the bridge of Revelation 19:1 to sing as a warm-up, which I think was a great way to set the right tone at the start of rehearsal.

After this year's BIDP, a great blessing was the creation of a shared arrangements bank, and being able to sing a few beautiful arrangements from other groups, such as "You Say," "Because He Lives," and "This is Living," in addition to our KS classics and arrangements by our very own Paul Kim. After scouring the internet, we were also able to get our hands on a wonderful arrangement of "Living Hope" for our Easter Arch! I hope to try my hand at arranging over the summer, and plan to continue to diversify our repertoire in the fall. Being Music Director has truly been such a joy and pleasure, and I am, once again, so grateful that God's plan turned out different from my own. I pray that He continues to use me to lead us in joyful noise, and that KS will be evidence of the joy that only comes through Him.




Meet the Newbies!
